Arbitrary Y instance

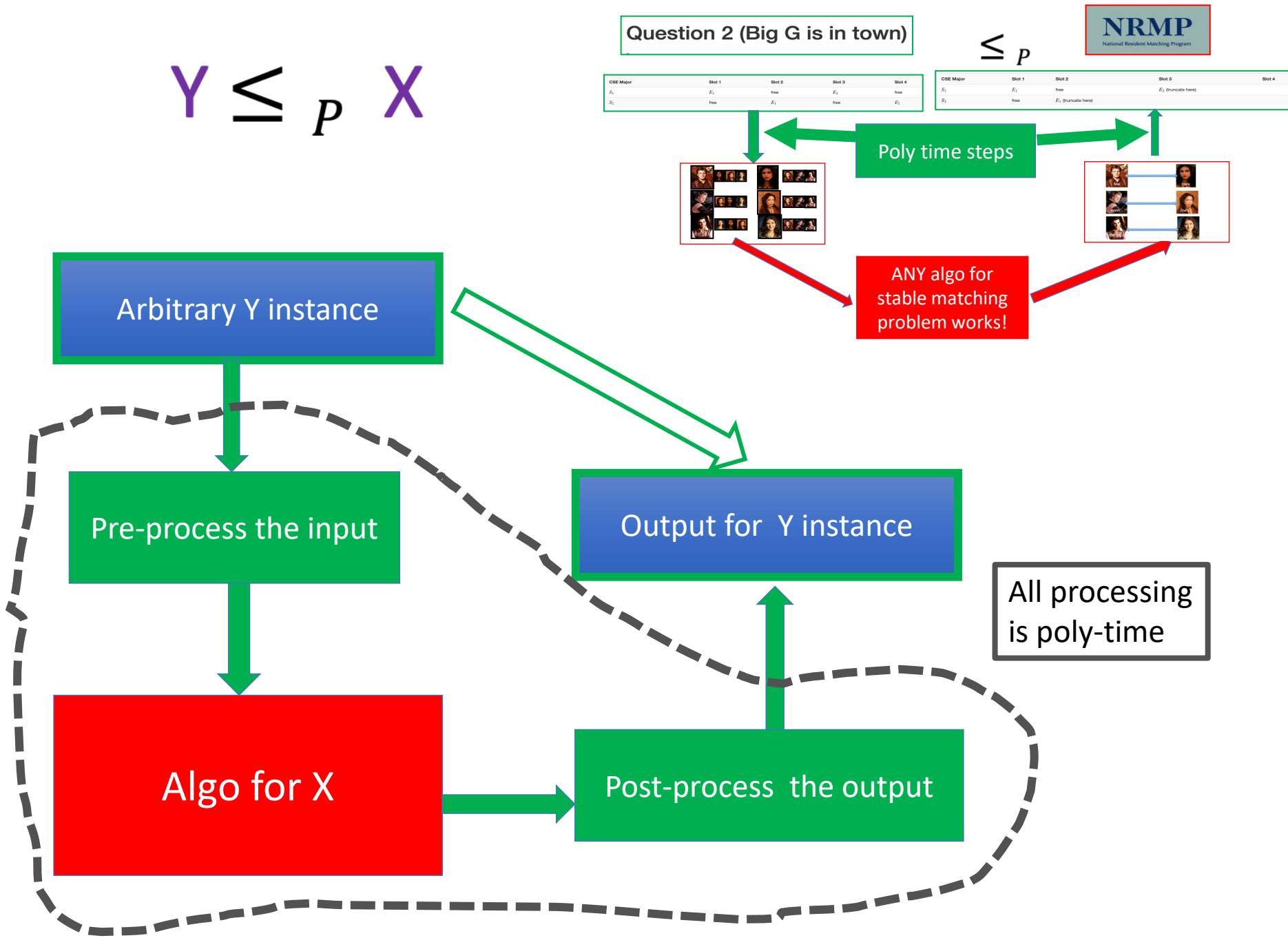
Pre-process the input

Algo for X

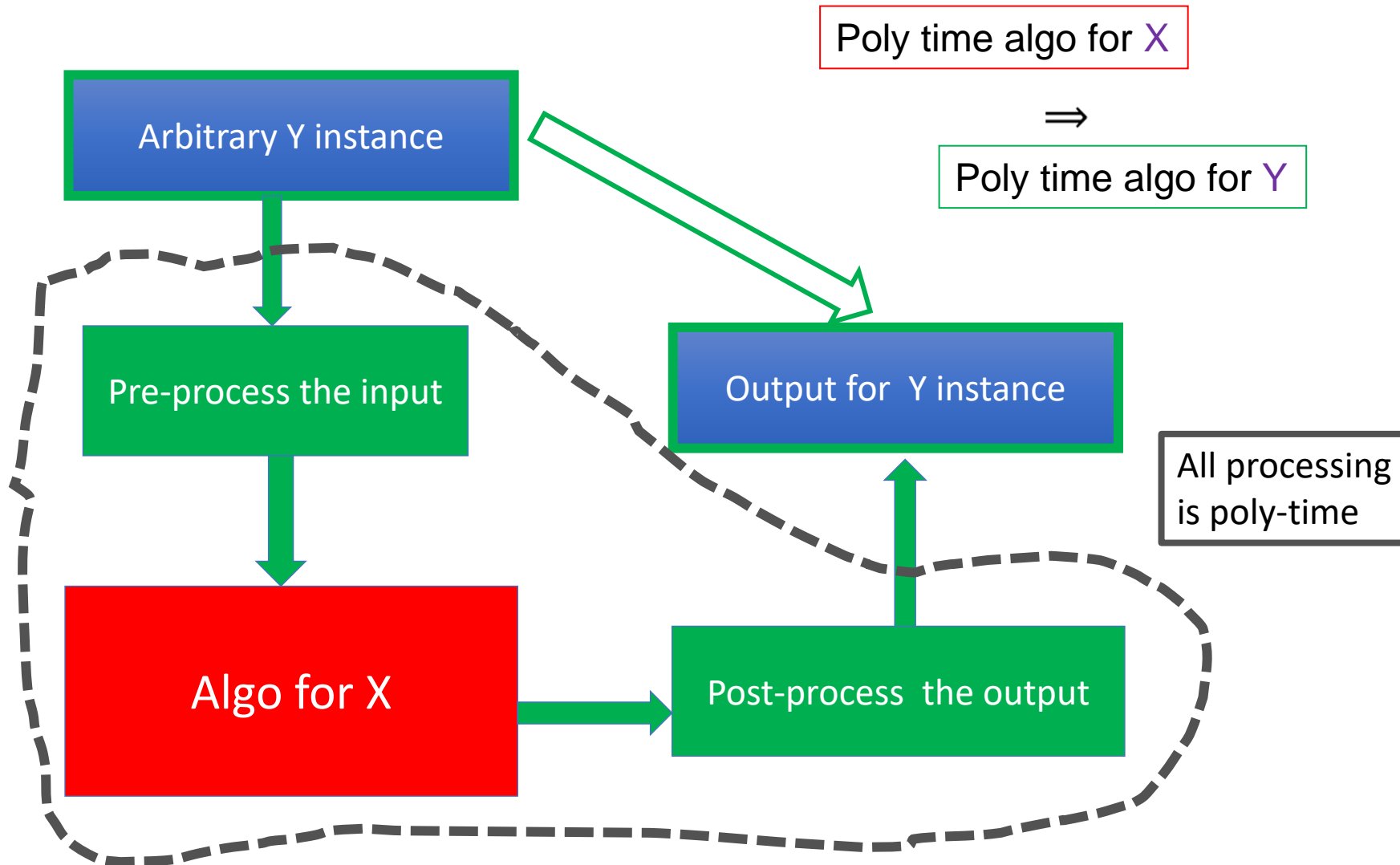
Output for Y instance

Post-process the output

All processing is poly-time
